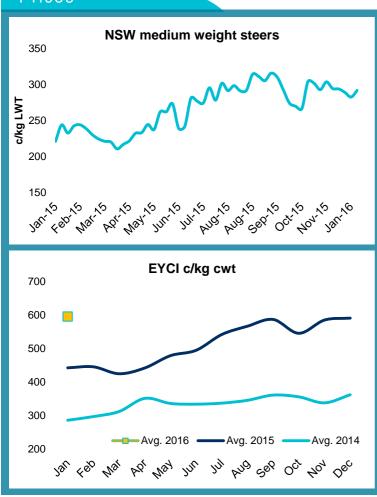
- In 2015 cattle prices regularly set new record highs. NSW medium weight steers were up 20% in 2015, finishing the year at 294 c/kg lwt. VIC medium weight steers were 31% higher, finishing at 275 c/kg lwt. The Eastern Young Cattle Indicator has started 2016 strongly, reaching 600c/kg cwt for the first time in mid-January.
- Slaughter rates trended lower during 2015 in both NSW and VIC, while demand remained high for Australian beef. In the twelve month period from October 2014 to November 2015, NSW and VIC beef exports combined were valued at over \$3 billion.
- The Bureau of Meteorology recently reported that the strong El Niño is persisting, however climate models suggest that the El Niño will decay over the coming months. Models also suggest that neutral and La Niña conditions are equally likely for the second half of 2016, with a repeat El Niño the least likely scenario.

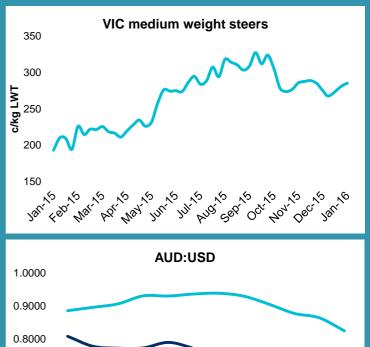

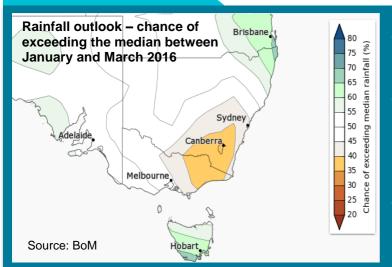
# Supply/Demand

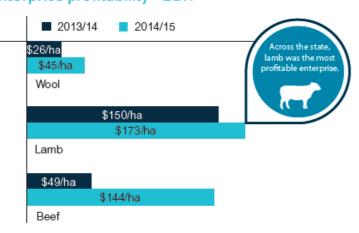
#### Weather



- Rainfall for December was average to below average across most of eastern and southern Australia.
- Looking out over the months ahead, the chances of a wetter or drier period to March are roughly equal in western Victoria and New South Wales. East of the Great Dividing Range a drier than normal period is expected (see map).
- The Bureau's ENSO tracker remains locked on an El Niño setting.
